## DANCER'S RESPONSIBILITY:

- 3. On the caller's command, "EV-ERYBODY go forward and back", they enter into the dance pattern.

## CALLER'S RESPONSIBILITY:

- 1. Recognize that a number of sets have broken down and formed lines at the sides of the hall.
- Place the dancing squares into lines that are in a normal boy girl arrangement.
- 3. Give the command "EVERYBODY go forward and back" in a bold voice to cue the lines when to begin dancing.
